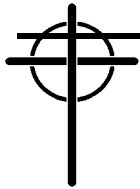

From the *Pastor's Pen*

Where Do You Find Community? That's a question worth reflecting upon. God has created us for 'face to face' community. Where do you find that kind of 'face to face' community? I hope that you'll say one of the places you find authentic community is in church.

Christianity is a communal faith. God intends for Christian people to live in community. Roland Williams, the Archbishop of Canterbury, says a church is "like that of a good marriage, in which mutual attention, giving and receiving, enjoyment and sacrifice are tightly woven together, as both realize that there is nothing good for one that is not good for both, nothing bad for one that is not bad for both, that fullness of life is necessarily a collaborative thing."

I like Williams' analogy of church to a good marriage. He is reminding us that community is much like a good marriage, where we commit to be there for each other in good times and hard times. At times, I fear Christians have been so captivated by our society's emphasis on individualism that we are in danger of losing this sense of authentic community.

The church is not just any community, but a community

united in their commitment to Jesus Christ. When Jesus gathered his people around the bread and the cup, he was creating a new community, called to work together for the kingdom of God. Jesus was intentionally building a new community. It is good to remember that we are called to this same sense of authentic community. We are looking for ways to build community here at First Baptist, creating more times in our life-together for people to connect to each other. I hope you will join in those times and build stronger ties with one another.

Of course, we don't gather to merely socialize with one another, but to do the work of Christ. I am excited about the variety of ways First Baptist is engaging in missions (Operation In As Much this May, the College Mission Trip to Honduras this May, the Family Mission Trip in the summer, and the Adult Mission Trip to Honduras in September to mention a few). Our church community has a larger purpose and vision calling us forth to make a difference in the our lives and the world. After all, Jesus created a community on a command and a promise: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." That's the kind of

community with which I want to be connected!

Josh and Stephanie Tucker on Mission! Many years ago, Carolyn and I were talking about missions and how the church could more effectively lead people to have a 'heart' for missions. Out of that conversation, came the idea of a College Mission Trip. Carolyn, then was the interim Minister of Youth, made plans for the first College Mission Trip to Honduras. The idea was that if we could plant the seed of missions in young folk's lives; they would be more mission-minded as adults. Josh Tucker was on that first College Mission Trip. Josh graduated from college, married and went to work for Merrill Lynch.

Josh and Stephanie have felt a call to medical missions and are now in training for beginning that venture in Ecuador with Medical Missions International. I've asked Josh and Stephanie to share with our church family about this new venture on Wednesday night, April 14. I hope you will join us. In the meantime, let's keep this young couple in our prayers and seek ways we can support them in their calling!

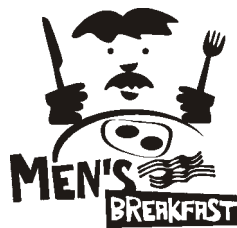

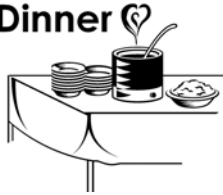

Thoughts and Reflections on Stewardship

Recently a friend told me about efforts she and her husband were making to teach their children about tithing and stewardship. During the previous week, their 9 year-old daughter, Kendra, had received some money in addition to her allowance. Her tithe that week amounted to three whole dollars! Generally, Kendra was quite willing to give to the Lord, but three dollars seemed a little harder to part with than the small amount she usually gave.

When Sunday came, Kendra unknowingly provided a lesson for others in her act of worship through giving. She carefully placed the three dollars in the offering plate with a not-quite-willing, - yet obedient - heart. As the plate passed to the other worshipers, Kendra longingly waved goodbye as her contribution was joined by the tithes of others.

That simple act of waving goodbye speaks so powerfully. As adults, we may feel, like Kendra, that we're saying goodbye to "our" money when we give our tithe to the Lord. But how we say goodbye teaches our children more about giving than the amount on our check ever will.

Operation Inasmuch FAQ's

What will it look like?

We will start our day in the sanctuary at 8:30 am for prayer, commissioning, and last minute "house-keeping." Then we will go to our respective work sites. We will work, under the guidance of a team leader(s), to complete our projects. Lunch will be delivered to your work site around noon. You will then resume work until about 4:30 pm.

What kind of projects will we do?

Final plans for projects are being fine-tuned, but *proposed* projects include:

- ▶ **Prayer team I** - to have prayer with people who are impacted by OIAM on project sites and go to ICU waiting rooms to have prayer with families.
- ▶ **Prayer team II** - to pray daily that Operation Inasmuch will reach out to people in the Southern Pines community and unite FBCSP through community projects *for the glory of God*.
- ▶ **Camp Duncan** - to participate in projects such as construction and/or trail clearing and development
- ▶ **Walker/wheelchair bags** - to make bags for walkers and/or wheelchairs for nursing home residents.
- ▶ **Hats for chemo patients** - to knit hats suitable for chemo patients.
- ▶ **Blood drive** - to hold a blood drive on the church site that will serve the Sandhills region.
- ▶ **Rummage sale** - to sell yard-sale type items for \$1 per item to benefit the Food Bank and/or Coalition.
- ▶ **Entertainment and Lord's Supper** - 1) to provide a variety of entertainment (i.e., singing, dancing, clowns, puppets, face painting, baton twirling, etc.) for nursing home residents and children in the park; 2) to offer the Lord's Supper to any residents at nursing homes who would like to receive it.
- ▶ **Food drive** - to solicit food donations to benefit the Food Bank and Coalition from patrons at local grocery stores.
- ▶ **Laundromat/grocery store assistance** - to offer random acts of kindness to exemplify the unconditional grace of God by providing quarters, detergent, fabric softener, and bleach to laundromat patrons and to provide assistance to grocery store patrons needing help with groceries.
- ▶ **Post card writing** - to share God's love with shut-ins, military personnel, and inmates at our local jail by writing notes to them.
- ▶ **Beautification** - to clean up, mulch, and plant at a Southern Pines location, possibly the blocks contiguous to church property to reinforce our concern for the neighborhood.
- ▶ **Health screening** - to provide blood pressure and other health screenings at high-traffic local sites such as drug stores, Pinecrest Plaza, or WalMart.

Then there will be a need for Support Teams to ensure that all these teams are successful such as:

- ▶ **Publicity** - to develop a campaign to promote OIAM to include skits, printed information, and a Power Point presentation to present in the worship service on May 2.
- ▶ **Photography** - to photograph events on May 1.
- ▶ **Childcare** - to provide childcare (birth to kindergarten) for INASMUCH volunteers,
- ▶ **Transportation** - to transport supplies and lunch to project sites, to retrieve food donations from food drive sites to be delivered to the church altar, and to coordinate pickup service for the Rummage,Sale Team.
- ▶ **Lunch prep** - to prepare bag lunches (sandwich, fruit, brownie or cookie, and bottle of water) for volunteers.

Many of these projects will need items, even before May 1, to make this effort successful: i.e., the Rummage Sale Team will need items to sell, the Walker Caddies will need fabric, the Chemo Caps need yarn, the Laundromat Project needs detergent, bleach, and fabric softener, the ICU Prayer Team needs snack items to carry to waiting rooms, the Lunch Prep Team needs cookies and brownies to add to lunch bags.

As you see there is a way for EVERYBODY to plug into this effort and serve the Lord. Please pray that we go where God wants us to go and that we do the things God wants us to do.
